Mixed School. "The work of the school has been seriously hampered by frequent and prolonged outbreaks of illness. The children are in consequence somewhat backward in attainments, but there is ample evidence of great efforts on the part of the teachers to meet the difficulty. The order of the school is very satisfactory."

Infant Class. "The infants are in good order and are, on the whole, making fairly good progress."
