Many dogs are known to be loyal, faithful friends - but perhaps this dog in Japan was the most loyal of them all.



Make a friendship band

- 1. Take three strands of wool in different colours.
- 2. Tie them together in a knot, and then secure this to a hard surface using tape (or ask someone to hold it).
 - 3. Arrange the three strands as shown.
- 4. Choose your left strand (green here) to start with. Cross it over the middle strand so it now becomes the central piece of wool.
- 5. Next, pick up the right strand of wool (red here). Cross this over into the middle (now green), so you have a new central strand again.
- 6. Lastly, take the left strand (now blue) and cross it over so it ends up in the middle again.
- 7. Keep to the same colour order all the way through the plaiting process. Here you would continue with green, red, blue taking turns to go into the middle



position.
