"Do not be afraid; I will be with you," God assured him.


Moses still wondered. He still had his doubts. "What if my own people don't even listen to me?" he asked, "what if they don't believe me?"

On that ordinary day, many extraordinary events were put into motion. Moses went to Egypt and performed many wonderful feats with his staff as he believed God.




Respect for Holy Books
