And so he was, until Jesus stopped right beneath the tree where Zacchaeus was.

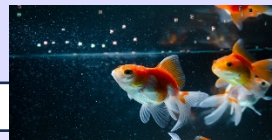
Jesus peered right up between the branches and saw the unpopular tax-collector hiding there.

On the festival of Rosh Hashanah, Jewish people take a picnic by a river or the sea.

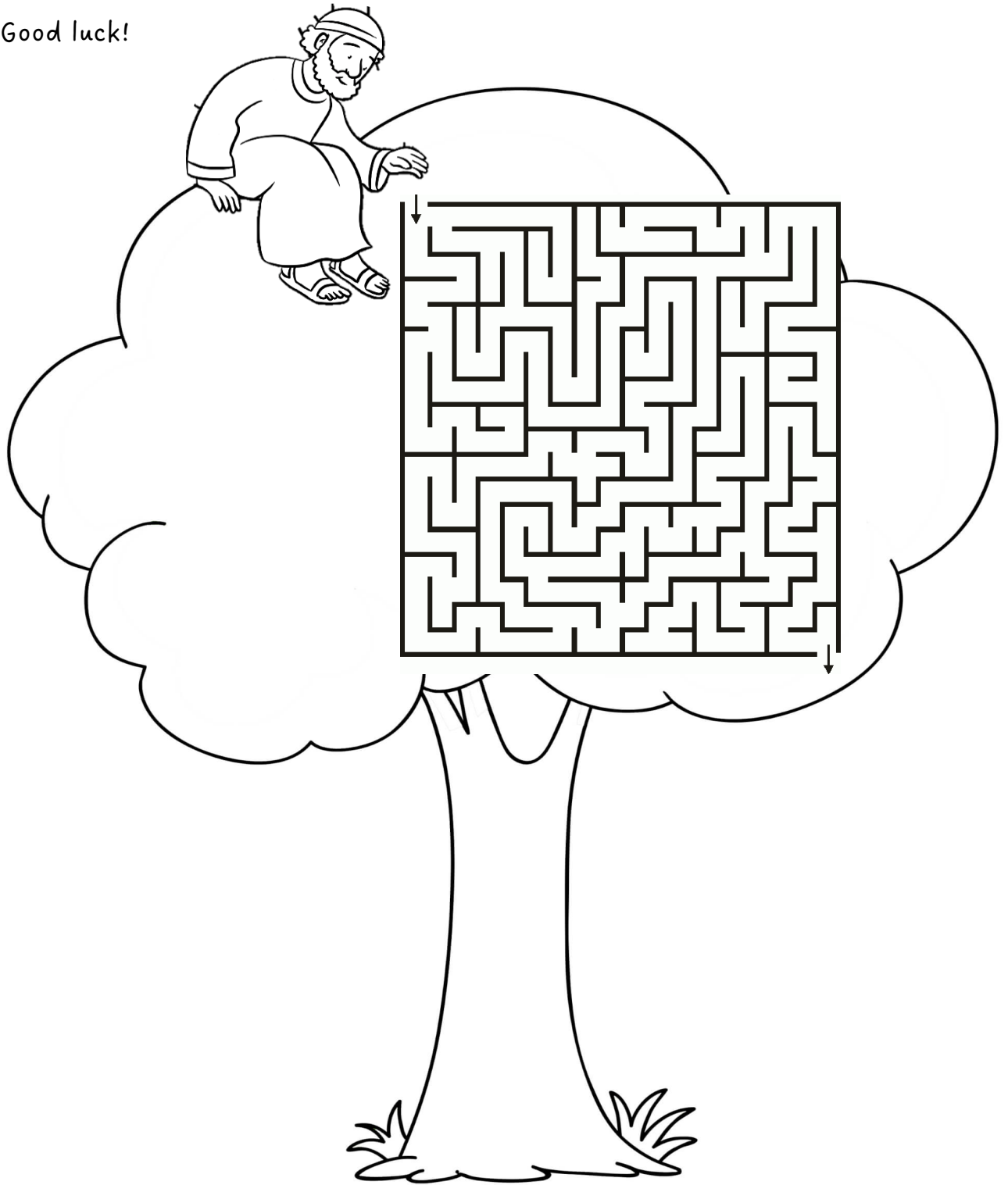
At the end of the picnic, they gather up all the crumbs and throw them into the water.
