The Alps Year 5

In DT we have been doing Mountains. It is extremely fun, and I wonder how people live in such harsh conditions. We tasted some of the food which the people in the Alps have. We had Brie which is French, Blue cheese from Italy, Goats cheese from France, Pretzels from Germany and Lindt chocolate from Switzerland. My favourite was the Brie cheese. We also made mountains out of Mod-Rock. First, we made the base from newspaper and then we covered it with Mod Rock. After that we made trees out of sponge and houses out of clay. In DT we have been learning about the Alps in Switzerland. We started our models by first making the base using newspaper with Mod-Rock on top of it. On the following Friday it was our Alpine Day. We tasted blue cheese, goat's cheese and brie. We then tried swiss chocolate and salted pretzels. On our next lesson we glued paper to our mountain base and stuck sponge trees around the bottom. The next step was to paint the bottom of our mountains green and then we had to wait for them to dry. After we made houses from clay and other construction materials and coloured them all different colours. The final thing we made was a ski lift out of sticks, poles, string and clay wheels. At the beginning we started learning about the Alps. We had plates full of food to try. Brie and goat's cheese from France, Pretzels from Germany, Gorgonzola from Italy and chocolate from Switzerland. For our models we used a big square piece of cardboard and we made to big sticks from newspaper, one taller than the other. We built up big balls of newspaper around them and covered them in Mod-Rock. When it was dry we painted the base. Next, we covered the mountain with glue and white tissue paper. The following week we put trees on. We did this by ripping sponges apart and painting them green and then sticking them around the base with PVA glue. We added houses made of clay and have also made cogs for the ski lift. We attached the cogs using straws and used string for the lift which we can then hang carriages off. By Maia
