## Situation Update

We hope that by now most of you have read the latest communications from school regarding the planning that we are currently undertaking in order for a 'possible' return to school at the beginning of June. (Emails were sent out on Thursday 14<sup>th</sup> May and are included on the news section of the school's website.)

We are receiving daily (and sometimes multiple) updates a day from the government and local authority. Holy Trinity is planning and adapting as best we can to this fluid situation. We would ask you all to continue being patient with us and rest assured that as soon as we have planned a clear way forward, we will let you know. Holy Trinity will not be returning as a normal school and there are many things that we need to consider to keep everyone safe before we can return.

We have also sent out communications to Key Workers children and classes RECEPTION, YEAR 1 and YEAR 6 asking for you to let us know of your intentions (should plans go ahead for schools to return) on June 1<sup>st</sup> about whether your child/children will be attending school.


